"Row of attached single-storey cottages. Corrugated iron roof with three decorative plastered gables (over no.s 37-39, 43-45 and 49-51) and intervening dormer windows with steep leaded roofs. Each gable has two windows. Rough plaster with smooth surrounds to openings. 2x2 sashes with louvred shutters; 4-panel doors with fanlights; plain timber doors with flanking projecting walls under each gable. Straight verandah with cast iron columns, brackets and lace cast iron work under verandah. narrow, unenclosed front gardens"
