"Single storey with half-hipped shingle roof with fretwork eaves closers; central round louvred dormer vent and two dormers with timber small-pane casements, decorative barge boards and fretwork eaves closers. Recessed full-length verandah under main roof with plaster mouldings to the arched masonry support. 5-panel door with side- and fanlights in an arched recess. Double timber casements to front facade; 2x2 sashes to side. All openings have plaster surrounds. Garden wall with capped posts, cast iron railings and cast iron gate."

"Built in 1904 for Rev Neethling, Minister of Stellenbosch (1858-1904), the well-known educationalist."
