Objects - Description

Visual Description

Long building with a simple central gable with straight sides, shoulders and a half-round top, decorated with swags and dated 1811. It has teak woodwork, including a stable door under the gable flanked by half-width sashes, large-paned 6x6 Georgian sashes, some with half-doors below opening to the terrace in front which is used as a restaurant (photo 2). There is a (pre-1938) parallel extension behind, and a courtyard (enclosed by extensions) which is used as a restaurant (photo 3). The main reception is in the west end of the cellar, with a portico over the road between it and north building 2 (photo 4).

Visual Description

The long building to the right of the house has holbol end gables and raised eaves. There are various openings including teak French doors with shutters and double casements. In front is a stoep with a pergola on masonry pillars, connected by flight of stairs to the south courtyard of the house. At the east end is a masonry stair giving access to the loft, which may also be accessed by an internal stair. The building is used as hotel rooms.

Albertyn states that this was the original main house with connected wine cellar described in Anna Hasselaar's 1790 inventory, and may incorporate Schryver's 1692 house -- though the thatch height has been raised and the holbol gables are later; the surviving casement windows may be original. It has been much altered and is now used as hotel rooms.

Significance Statement

Thought to incorporate fabric from Isaak Schryver's original house, this was the main house before the construction of the 1830 house and the formalisation of the werf. Considerably altered through time, it is a building with many layers of intervention; historically significant and an intrinsic part of the werf.

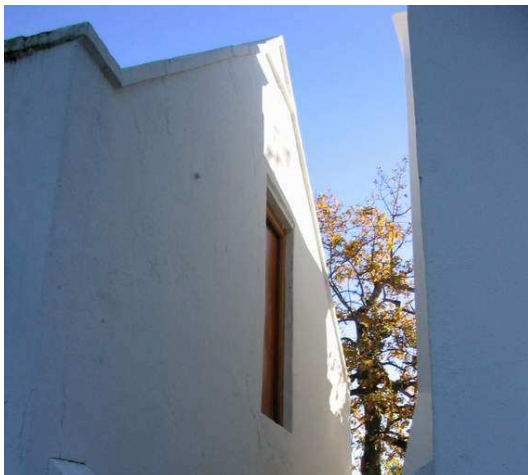

Visual Description

Thatched L-shaped building in the south east corner of the werf, in line with the back of the house and creating a courtyard with it and the end of the old house. It has pointed end gables with triangular caps. Facing into the courtyard, the west side under a reed-roofed pergola has double casements with solid shutters, and the north side has tall casements and (salvaged and re-used?) teak doors and tall casements. The east side has 3x4 sashes and French doors. There is a flat-roofed extension on the south side.

Albertyn states that the original werf (before Fick's 19th C additions) had the old main house with connected wine cellar, the buildings in the south-east corner, the re-built henhok [not mentioned in inventory] and cowshed (koeistalle) (Albertyn c1997:26-7). During the conversion of the werf into a hotel after Rawdon purchased the property in 1958 the existing outbuildings were converted into hotel rooms.
