Fluted pilasters slightly in from corners. 12x12 Georgian sashes with plain plaster surrounds; 3x3 door with sunrise fanlight and fine pilaster architrave. Low wall with capped posts and dipped panels."
HISTORY:	"Once used as a smithy by CM Bruins & Co, in the 1930s it housed the dental surgery of Dr Jan de Witt (Meiring & van Huyssteen)."
