| HISTORY: | "Originally a single storey thatched farmhouse, with outbuildings, visible on Hertzog's 1817 plan. It predates Van Ryneveld St and is aligned with a pre-existing lane (see also 25.02B, ""Skuinshuis""). During the 18th Century the farm was known as Willow" |
