SITE & STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION:	"Double-storey building of two 3-bay units with single-pitch corrugated iron roof and double-storey concrete verandah with precast balustrades and Tuscan columns. Shops on ground floor have fine timber shopfronts with decorative cast iron freize at the top and recessed entrances with glazed panelled doors; door to flats on first floor has 4 panels, the top two arched. First floor has rusticated quoins and facade, 6x6 sashes, French doors and a glazed Edwardian door."
