SITE & STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION:	Double storey 3-bay building with mansard roof and corner pilasters. Projecting porch with arches and balusters. 2x2 door with arched fanlight; arched timber windows with plaster surrounds. Circular fountain with statue in circular drive. Fine boundary wall with capped posts.
HISTORY:	"Erected in 1905 to house SA's first higher school of music, which has since 1934 been part of the University of Stellenbosch."
