SITE & STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION:	"Double storey building with straight parapet above projecting cornice with Spanish tile capping, and rock faced ashlar stone plinth and architrave. Corner slightly recessed, with plaster moulding over panelled double doors with ornate fanlights. Ornate panelled side doors in Andringa St with carved stone architrave and tall 20x20 sash above. All joinery teak: 12x12 sashes to first floor and 16x16 sashes with panelled half-shutters to ground floor. Modern double storey extension in Andringa St with 12x12 sashes to first floor, rusticated plinth and double storey concrete screen"
