HERITAGE ANALYSIS

SITE & STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION:	The main house is dated 1793, and is an H-shaped structure, completely moderised, but with an interesting front gable. The barn, with triangular pediment on axis, has a corrugated-iron pitched roof, with extensive monopitch addition at rear. Although altered, it may well be the oldest structure on the site (Fransen, 2004: 221). It houses the De Kuipe Restaurant.
HISTORY:	Granted in 1697 to Jacob de Wilde, transferred in 1700 to Arend Gildenhuys. In 1778 it came into the ownership of the De Villiers family, who owned the farm for generations.
