HERITAGE ANALYSIS

SITE & STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION:	Square-gabled house dated 1849. It has the rectangular plan, two rooms deep, that was customary at that date. The house now has a half-hipped slate roof (Fransen, 2004: 213). The underground Hartenberg Cellar was commissioned in the late 1980s, and is decorated with twelve stained-glass artworks by German coppersmith, Karl Heinz Wilhelm. They took two years to complete, and describe each of the twelve phases of cultivating and producing wine.
HISTORY:	In 1704, Christoffel Esterhuizen was granted the title deed to "Het Hartenberg" by Willem Adriaan van der Stel. The well-known elephant hunter, Paulus Keyser, bought Hartenberg in 1721. He sold it to Jacob van Bochen in 1725. Van Bochen, a former acco
