SITE & STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION:	The homestead would once have been U-shaped under a thatched roof, but now is under hipped corrugated-iron roof, with extensions and replaced elements. A modest homestead, now embedded within an industrial complex and barely discernable from the agri-industrial structures.
HISTORY:	Granted in 1693 to Jan Wismaar, transferred to Garment van Brakel in 1708 (hence the historic name "Brakelsdal"). Francois Roos became owner in 1786 and likely built a homestead on the same site. In 1846 Michiel Nicolaas Louw became the owner.
