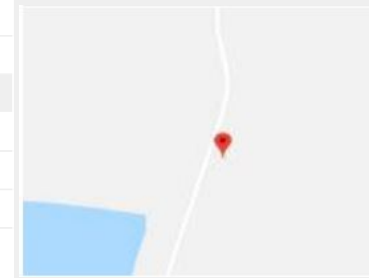
HERITAGE ANALYSIS

SITE & STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION:	"The present house... has a rectangular, two-rooms-deep ground-plan and shows no signs of having incorporated an older house. The small front-gable is dated 1850, and the house has a very low pitched (but thatch) roof. Behind are two outbuildings, forming a courtyard slightly splayed in plan (Fransen, 2004: 228).
HISTORY:	Granted in 1698 to Henning Huysing, and transferred from owner to owner in line with Meerlust's ownership until 1816, when the farms were separated and Klavervallei came under the ownership of Pieter Gerhard.
