HERITAGE ANALYSIS

SITE & STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION:	Unusual werf, with the homestead set lower down than the cellars, which are located on a flat terrace further up the hill. An historic cellar, facing the approach along Annandale road, but somewhat over-sanitised since the 1960 photograph reproduced in Franssen (2004). Two additional modern cellar structures have been added to the building, without any gasket or setback. The historic homestead has been altered to such an extent that it has lost all sense of authenticity. Some original gateposts exist further down the road and opposite the homestead, indicating a possible alternate approach ...
HISTORY:	Willem Jansz van den Wereld (first granted, 1694), Gerrit Vredenberg, Adriaan van Brakel. Van Brakel as his son likely built the historic structures. Today Bilton wines runs a large cellar on the site, with a fairly industrial character. The historic cell
