HERITAGE ANALYSIS

SITE & STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION:	A large werf, enclosed by outbuildings that are splayed towards the mountains. A low werf wall encircles the space, with mature planting reinforcing the spatial structure. An H-shaped homestead with fine gables and joinery is positioned to the west of the werf space. The homestead has fine original joinery, as well as restored gables. The splayed werf, and the relationship its geometry creates with the adjacent Blaauwkip River and the foothills and peaks of the Helderberg beyond, is very fine. The more modern structures, accommodating both farming and entertainment elements, are located to the ...
