SITE & STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION:	Complex with trout hatchery. Sturdy dressed-stone hatching-house, situated amongst a clutter of office buildings. Two original trout dams (unaltered) form part of the site. Large remnant trees including Yellowwoods (<i>Podocarpus henkelli</i>).
HISTORY:	Government initiative to stock the Eerste River with a larger fish species (trout) than the indigenous. This hatchery apparently stocked the rivers all the way to the Eastern Cape.
