HERITAGE ANALYSIS

SITE & STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION:	This cottage is possibly older than the other cottages in the area - it has distinct Bakeresque, Arts and Crafts stylistic references. In particular, the very steep thatched roof is unique and key to the character of the cottage. Additionally, the location of the cottage along the end of a wooded road, and with a front lawn encircled by trees, gives it a sense of isolation.
HISTORY:	Rustenburg was granted in 1682 to Roelof Pasman, in 1699 it was transferred to Pieter Robbertsz. Thereafter it was transferred to Pieter Loubser (1742) and Hendrik Ostwald Laubscher (1771), until it came into the ownership of Jacob Eksteen in 1786.
