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| SITE & STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION: | Two modest, single-storey structures under pitched roof with end gables and lean-to additions at the back. The houses are positioned at right angles to one another. Punctured whitewashed masonry walls define a central space between the two structures. |
| HISTORY: | Originally a missionary community for emancipated slaves established by Barnabas Shaw following the abolition of slavery at the Cape in 1834. The original lots were rented out to 800 freed slaves. The church was built in 1861. |
