HERITAGE ANALYSIS

SITE & STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION:	A linear werf arrangement, with an extended T-shaped and U-shaped thatched structure facing towards the street, and "bookended" to the south by a long barn, said to be much older (Fransen, 2004: 193). The front gables of the two primary buildings are very fine. A c1915 Arthur Elliot photograph shows a double row of Oak trees in front of these structures, completing the composition of the werf. Today, a combination of oaks and conifers performs this task, but the religious/institutional use of the complex is apparent.
HISTORY:	First granted in 1683 to Jan Jansz van Eeden, in 1763 the farm was transferred to Jacob Groenewald, and in 1830 to PH Faure (Fransen, 2004: 193).
