SITE & STRUCTURE DESCRIPTION:	"Pedestrian gateway with arched opening, now with wooden gate, capped with a raised ornament between two scrolls."
HISTORY:	"The block, which was the site of the original church, was subdivided in 1783. The gateway was probably constructed in the garden wall by the first owner. It had the same plasterwork as the gables on the homesteads of Ida's Valley and Vredenburg-Vlottenberg (both 1789). (Oberholster)"
