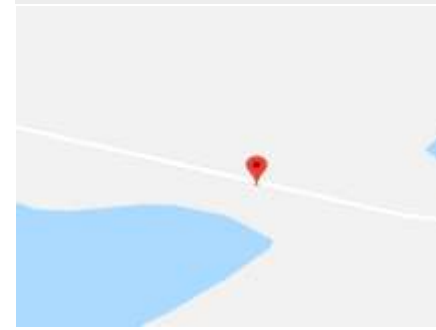

**SITE DESCRIPTION**

An avenue of trees approaching the Meerlust farm werf, the trees alternate between Palms and Oaks, and the road has been paved in textured brick. The avenue has landmark significance when approaching Stellenbosch from the R310, and with the Meerlust dam creates a gateway into the winelands.
