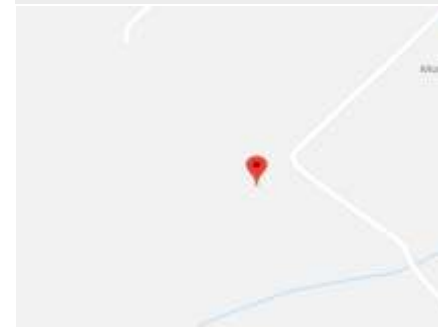

SITE DESCRIPTION

Farm complex. Originally T-plan house converted to H-plan c.1800. Well-preserved, two perfect facades; river front gable (1815) similar to road front gable (1800); set in simple grassed lawn with mature oaks. Outbuildings and bell-tower.
