Altered Cape Dutch homestead (gable 1849), several barns / outbuildings and Baker-designed cottage.

The historically layered farm nucleus, comprising Cape Dutch/Victorian/Cape Revival structures and spatial and landscape orders and avenues, has intrinsic aesthetic, architectural and landscape significance. There is also associational significance given the roles of Pickstone, Rhodes and Baker in the development of the site.
