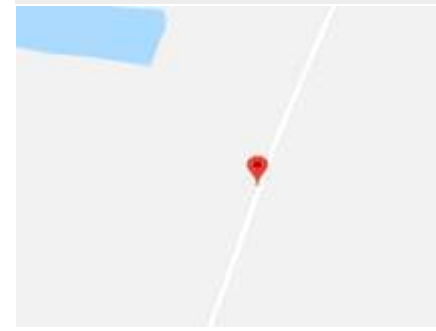

**SITE DESCRIPTION**

Single-storey hipped corrugated-iron roof asymmetrical villa with 90 degree stoep on concrete pillars and balustrade with flaring steps, two gable ends. Intact.

**STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

This site is representative of the early-20th century building that occurred within the Bottelary. Its scale is sensitive to the area. It has some architectural interest, and contextual significance. In addition, it has historical significance as the site of an acclimatization camp for English troops during the South African (Anglo-Boer) War.
