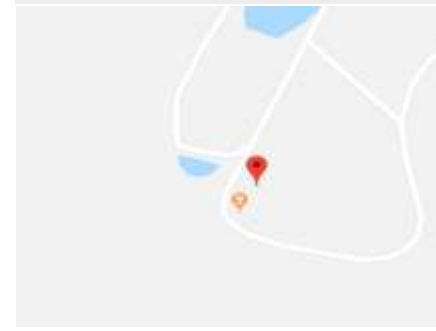

SITE DESCRIPTION

Long house, single room deep, with Georgianised Cape Dutch facade, and stoep, masonry stairs to attic with buttresses. Single-storey thatched roof, central (both front and rear) and end gables. Barn with mock gable has date 1823 or 1828; middle barn Anglicised with round-headed windows. Upslope, about 200m away is a Victorian structure.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

An example of the linear werf type in this area, this farm constitutes a layered site, with each alteration and addition being clearly discernable. The site has considerable historical, architectural and contextual significance. It is magnificently sited against the Simonsberg, and has high scenic significance.
