SITE DESCRIPTION

Altered longhouse, original barn and replica wine cellar, altered H-plan Cape Dutch house, werf with bell-tower and ornamental walled pond. Additional 1980s winery and later large French-style winery and tourist facility.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This site constitutes a layered, but highly complete and restored square werf type. It is spectacularly sited, in the foothills of the Simonsberg. The site has some historical and architectural significance, as well as high contextual and scenic significance.
