SITE DESCRIPTION

H-shaped homestead with outbuildings restored to 17th century form, with central dormer gable. Characteristic dormer gable. Werf wall of some age. A more modern farm werf is located to the north. Old avenue aligns to R44.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This werf has been altered and is layered over time, although the various periods of change are discernable. The farm indicates an older pattern of settlement along the R44. It retains high historic, contextual and aesthetic significance.
