An avenue of mature Stone Pines lining the southern side of Adam Tas Road, that presumably would once have been replicated on the opposite side of the street.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The avenue of mature Stone Pines, forms a unique avenue approach within the winelands. The avenue has landscape, landmark, contextual and scenic significance. It is a rare, remaining example of a once more widespread landscape pattern.
