ARCHITECT/BUILDER

SITE DESCRIPTION

Simple long house plan, pitched roof with end gables, original windows and six-panel teak French door with curved fanlight, simple metal posts supporting veranda on two sides. Dated 1913. Round ventilator in gable. Likely religious.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The site adds layering and context to the Vlottenburg node. It has historical and contextual significance. As a church/community structure, it has additional social and symbolic significance.

INTERIOR DESCRIPTION

GROUPING WITH OTHER SITES

Yes, with 1931 adjacent site. The site is also grouped with numerous, modest church and civic buildings located at road junctions throughout the Eerste River valley, and which predominantly served the farm worker community.
